Lent gives way to Easter! - P.T.'s Practical Theology

"Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. Matthew 28:1-3

The penitential season of Lent spans 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. It is then that Lent gives way to the joyous season of Easter, this year on April 20th. And do you know what event will again in our area mark the passing from Lent to Easter? The Shrine Circus!!

The first time the Watertown Shrine Club hosted the circus on Holy Saturday, I was serving a church in Watertown. I remember my neighbor across the street who was a member of the Shine, came over to my house to tell me of the "unfortunate schedule" before it was broadcast around town. Well, I remember that I was a bit dismayed. But I did understand that local club did not get to set the date but had to take a day that was available by the traveling circus. Yet, as my neighbor was apologizing for the Shrine's largest fundraiser falling during Holy Week, I got to thinking that Holy Saturday might not be such a bad day for a Circus Break!

Think about it! After leaving worship in silence on Good Friday, do we really need to stay afflicted and grieved for another 36 hours prior to our Easter Worship? Shouldn't there be some buffer that helps us span the stark contrasts of Good Friday with Easter? So, why not take the kiddos up to Watertown to attend the circus as a primer for Easter worship!

With a little imagination, the ear-splitting music of the circus performance is almost like the sound of an earthquake!

With a little imagination, the performers under the circus lights may even look like lighting... with their clothing as white as snow.

For that is the buffer that Matthew's Gospel gives us between the events of Good Friday and the Easter proclamation. And what a glorious proclamation it is!! "The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He has risen!"

So, come be with us during Holy Week:

Come and join in the shouts of "Hosanna" on Palm Sunday.

Come and hear of Jesus who gives a new and eternal meaning to bread and wine.

Come and hear of Jesus who gave his life in order that we may have life.

Go to the Circus and cast off the Lenten dreariness, then

Come and hear of the wonder of the ages....for Christ has Risen! He has risen indeed!




Something's Fishy!!

Church Council Meeting Minutes American Lutheran Church February 9th, 2025

Members Present: Danny Davis, Jessie Ruml, Lindsey Vetter, Pastor Tom, John Bucher, Amanda Pribbenow, Doug Strait, Traci Bass, Al Schochenmaier and Mark Larson.

Call to Order: Vice President Vetter called the meeting to order, declaring a voting quorum as being present.

Prayer: Led by Pastor Tom

Meeting Minutes: Review of January 19th, 2025, meeting minutes. An error was noted in that Amanda Pribbenow was not listed as being present when in fact she was present at the January 19th, 2025, meeting. Motion by Traci Bass and second by Doug Strait to approve the amended minutes. **MC**

Financial Report: Treasurer Strait presented the January 2025 financial report for review. Motion by Mark, second by Amanda to approve the report as presented. **MC**

Pastor's Report: Pastor Tom handed out information on an upcoming Joint Convocation for Eastern South Dakota and Minkota Mission Districts (NALC) to be held at Hosana Lutheran Church in Watertown, SD on April 4th and 5th, 2025. Pastor encouraged Council members to be present for this event and that he will also be announcing this event to the Congregation in the coming weeks.

Pastor Tom is working on finalizing plans for the youth mission trip which will be in Minneapolis, MN thru Global Health Ministries (https://www.ghm.org/)

Pastor Tom also discussed the upcoming Lenten Season and weekly youth meal in which he will prepare the "main course" of the meal and youth/parents will be asked to provide dessert(s).

Old Business:

The base trim in the basement will need to be removed prior to the floor being finished. A discussion was held concerning the two bids received to date for the application of epoxy. One bid was \$11,250.00 and the other was \$9,132.00. The low bid was received from Total Epoxy of Brookings, SD. President Bucher mentioned that the cost for grinding and polishing of the floor (no epoxy application) was within a few hundred dollars of the epoxy application cost. A motion was made by Jessie Ruml with a second by Traci Bass to accept the bid from Total Epoxy with the understanding that President

Bucher will visit with Total Epoxy to determine any possible decrease in their bid as well as color choices. **MC**

New Business:

The east overhang supports / handrails are essentially completed and ready for installation. Installation will be completed when the weather / temperatures improve.

A suggestion was made by a member of the Congregation to a council member concerning looking into the purchase and installation of a security system and/or security cameras for the Church. A discussion was held concerning this subject including the logistics, number of cameras and entrance doors to be monitored and if anyone was aware of any prior incidents that would have precipitated this suggestion. After discussion, it was the Council's unanimous decision to not pursue this currently.

The election of Church Council positions for 2025 was held. Current positions are:

A unanimous vote/motion was cast by Traci Bass for the current Council positions to remain the same for 2025. Danny Davis seconded this, and all members were in favor. **MC.**

Closing: With no further matters at hand a Motion by Traci Bass to adjourn. Second by Jessie Ruml. **MC.**
