and your gates Praise. The sun shall be no more your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon give you light; but the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory. 

Call to Order: President Bucher called the meeting to order.

Meeting Minutes: Review of the August 2025 meeting minutes. Motion by Doug Strait and a 2nd by Amanda Pribbenow to approve. **MC**

Financial Report: Treasurer Strait presented the August 2025 financial payment report for review. Motion by John Bucher, second by Lindsey Vetter to approve the report as presented. **MC**

Pastor's Report: Pastor Tom gave his report to include a brief discussion about Bible Study and Youth Group.

Old Business:

The basement trim has been ordered and should arrive soon. Council members will then discuss the installation. No further action taken.

ADVENT TRADITIONS

- On December 13, Scandinavian countries honor Saint Lucy (or Lucia), a third-century martyr who, according to legend, brought food to people in the catacombs during winter. For light and to be able to carry as much food as possible she wore a wreath of candles on her head. On St. Lucy's Day, the oldest daughter gets up early and brings sweet rolls to family members. The tradition reminds Christians that Jesus is a gift of light and love for our dark world.
- In Normandy, children used to set fires in fields during Advent. The flames killed caterpillar eggs and drove away rodents. The tradition reflected good conquering evil, just as God's perfect Son rescues us from sin.
